Program Personnel and Resources	
How is the required staffing ratio of 4.0 patients per faculty hour or less calculated?	The formula for calculating the faculty staffing ratio is the total number of patients divided by the number of hours, divided by four.
	Example: The emergency department census is 100,000 patients per year divided by 365 days, so 274 patients per 24-hour day. If every attending saw four patients per hour, a program would require 69 hours of faculty member coverage. If faculty members worked eight-hour shifts, this would mean 8.5 shifts per day, or three faculty members for the 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. shift; four faculty members for the 3:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.
Advanced Specialty Requirement: II.B.1.	shift; and two faculty members for the 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. shift.
Resident Appointment	
Will a citation result if a program has fewer than four residents per year due to resident leave of absence, military service, off-cycle residents, etc.?	No. The Review Committee-International understands that circumstances occur resulting in fewer than four residents per year in a program. If the program admits at least four residents each year, a citation will not result.

What clinical settings can be used to provide clinical experiences in critical care of infants and children?	These experiences can occur in the emergency department, pediatric intensive care unit, or neonatal intensive care unit.
