Additionally, there is no evidence that the specific ratio of 1:1 is associated with program quality. There is no requirement for total number of faculty members in the US

The revision is intended to convey the Review Committee-International's expectation that the program director's certification should be equivalent to ABMS certification.			
three residents in each year of the The number of available positions in the program must be at least one per year unless otherwise specified in the specialty-specific Program	348-351	The requirement was revised to simplify language, provide flexibility to programs, and clarify that the expectation relates to the availability of positions, not the actual number of residents enrolled in each year of the program.
